SIGNS OF DISTRESS

For child care, financial, insurance and other questions, call: 1-833-551-0518.

Children in distress could display:

- Excessive worry, anxiety, or sadness



- Avoidance of activities they enjoy
- Returning to behaviors they have outgrown
- "Acting out" in teens or excessive crying in young kids

- Changes in their appetite or sleep
- Headaches, body pains, skin rashes

SUPPORTING CHILDREN



Talk with them

- Reassure them
- Address rumors
- Answer questions

Set a good example by taking care of yourself

- Wash your hands
- Avoid touching your face



Limit their exposure to media and social media coverage of the event
