

NMASBHC Youth Health Advisory Group FAQs

Youth voice is vital to the field of school-based health care in New Mexico. The Youth Health Advisory Group is a youth-led service group that gives youth, age 14-21 the opportunity to share their expertise on important health topics, advance health care access for their peers, cultivate knowledge about public health and health care and serve as a change agent in their community.

What does a Youth Advisor do?

- Represent and advocate for School-Based Health Centers (SBHCs) and services in New Mexico
- Advocate for equitable and youth-friendly healthcare
- Share expertise and ideas about improving access for youth seeking healthcare in New Mexico
- Serve as a change agent in their community as reflected through a service project

How do I become a Youth Advisor?

Applications are open on April 1st, 2022. For priority consideration, apply by Friday, April 22nd. We will review applications and reach out by April 29th. NMASBHC requests a one-year commitment from selected students, with the opportunity to reapply in future years.

What are the benefits of becoming a Youth Advisor?

- Opportunity to have a positive impact on your community
- Build relationships and team-building skills with other youth in New Mexico
- Expand on advocacy skills and engage in public health efforts that affect youth

Who is eligible to participate?

Youth who are between the ages 14-21 that live in the state of New Mexico.

How and where will we meet?

The Youth Advisors will meet twice a month from 4:00-5:00 PM. Meetings will initially be held virtually, by Zoom. There may be opportunity to have in-person meetings in the future. If students need support accessing broadband internet access, NMASBHC will provide it where possible.

I don't have past leadership experience. Can I still apply?

Absolutely! Passion and willingness to learn are two key components in being a successful Youth Advisor. Also, you can get leadership experience from participating in the group.

Will I get paid?

Youth Advisors can receive gift cards for participation (up to \$500 per student/calendar year), as follows:

- \$10 per meeting and community activity or event attended
- \$100 upon completion of a community service project
